Said highway has its beginning point on the line between sections Twenty-five (25) and Twenty six (26) in Township Six (6) South, Range Ten (10) West of Vanderburgh County, Indiana where that line is intersected by the line dividing said section Twenty five (25) into the north and south half of such section, said beginning point being the point of intersection of said Lincoln Avenue road and the public highway known as the Green River Road in said Vanderburgh County; from said beginning point said highway extend due East along said half section line across said section Twenty five (25) and also across section Thirty (30) in Township Six (6) South, of Range Nine (9) west; said highway has its termination at the eastern boundary of said section Thirty (30) where said half section line reaches said boundary, ~~which~~ is also the boundary of said Knight Township, and of Vanderburgh County.

Said highway as it exists at the present time is a public highway about thirty (30) feet in width, extending along said half section line; it is popularly used and has been graded and kept in good condition, but is not a free gravel road.

Said highway hereinbefore described and herein asked to be improved is part of a highway crossing said Township from the City of Evansville, the part extending from the city of Evansville to the beginning point above described, being at present, a free gravel road or macadamized road, which free gravel road is the beginning point of said proposed improvement and the point of termination of said proposed improvement is said boundary line of said Knight Township and Vanderburgh <sup>County</sup>. The total length of said proposed improvement is less than three miles.

We recommend <sup>that</sup> the width of the paving upon said highway shall be twelve feet, and that said improvement shall be made by properly grading, and preparing a bed upon said highway with proper drainage, and placing thereon sufficient covering of broken rock covered with fine screenings, all of which shall be properly packed and smoothed upon said highway, said rock being

placed nine (9) inches deep in the middle of the road and graded off to seven (7) inches at the edges.

Sant et al. in the Court of County Commissioners of Vanderburgh County, State of Indiana in their June Term 1911

General -

No. 1. In all the following general and detail specifications the term "Board" shall be accepted as the designation of the Board of County Commissioners of Vanderburgh County State of Indiana; the term "Engineer" shall be accepted to designate the civil engineer appointed by the Board to direct the construction of said improvement; the term "Superintendent" shall be accepted to designate the citizen of Knight Township, of said County and State appointed by the Board to superintend said construction as laid out by the Engineer under the Boards approval the term Contractor shall be accepted to designate the individual or individuals to whom to contract for the construction of said Improvement, in whole or in part, has been let by the Board.

No. 2. The Board shall be the judge to decide all controversies arising between engineer, superintendent, and contractor as to the interpretation of terms in the specifications the quality of material, the employment of competent labor the mode and sequence of construction, and the receiving of the finished work.

No. 3. The said improvement of said Lincoln Avenue Road shall consist of grading the road bed using the line-stakes in place and the grade laid down on the profile marked Exhibit "A" as guides covering or macadamizing said graded roadbed to a width of twelve feet (six feet on either side of the center line as laid out by the Engineer) with crushed lime-stone and lime stone screenings; a five-foot addition to the north end of a brick-culvert at Station 59.57 the placing of a thirty foot culvert, thirty inches in diameter at the intersection of the Newburgh Road the placing of crushed rock and screenings, at all intersections named in the details specifications, to the limit of the road width; the placing of crushed rock, as a dam, breakwater upon or revetment at such places and in such manner as will be further specified in said detail specifications.

No. 4. The contractor shall, during working hours, give

No. 5. Whenever, during the construction of said improvement the contractor has in his employment at said work a gang boss, foreman, workman or other employee who in the opinion of the Board, the engineer or the superintendent, hinders, retards or jeopardizes the progress and efficiency of the work by reason of incompetency, neglect or malice said contractor shall upon the demand of the Board (or the engineer or the superintendent if so empowered by the Board) discharge such individual from further employment, in the capacity found faulty, on said improvement.

No. 6. All obstructions within the limits of the lines of said improvements, (except telegraph or telephone poles) such as grass, weeds, briars, brush, drift, planks, trees, including their stumps shall be removed by the contractor from within said limits without additional recompense therefor.

No. 7. During the progress of construction the contractor shall not obstruct passage to and from the farms and homesteads adjoining the lines of said improvement but give ample facilities for ingress and egress to and from the same. Section 11.2 That said bonds shall be in denominations of 400 Dollars each shall bear interest at the rate of four and one half per cent (4 1/2%) per annum, payable semi-annually (except as otherwise provided herein) upon the 15th days of May and November in each year, shall be divided into twenty (20) equal series of 400 bond each; the first series, principal and interest, shall mature and be payable on the 15th day of May 1913, and one series principal and interest, each six months thereafter until all are paid. Said bonds shall bear date the 1st day of November, 1911, and shall be signed by the Board of Commissioners of Vanderburgh County and authenticated by the Auditor. The interest on said bonds shall be evidenced by coupons thereto attached bearing a lithographed fac simile signature of the County Auditor. The principal and interest of said bonds shall be payable at the office of the County Treasurer of Vanderburgh County, Indiana at his office in the Court House in the city of Evansville.

Section 11.1. - For the purpose of raising money to meet said bonds and interest thereon as the same mature, said Board of Commissioners shall annually hereafter, at the time the general tax levy is made, levy a special tax upon all the taxable property in said Knight Township, both within and without any and all incorporated towns or

cities in said township, and said tax shall be collected as other taxes are collected and shall be applied to the payment of such bonds and interest and for no other purpose.
